Cables exiting a trench and running on a cable tray must be properly supported, segregated, and protected to ensure safety, reliability, and compliance with electrical standards.

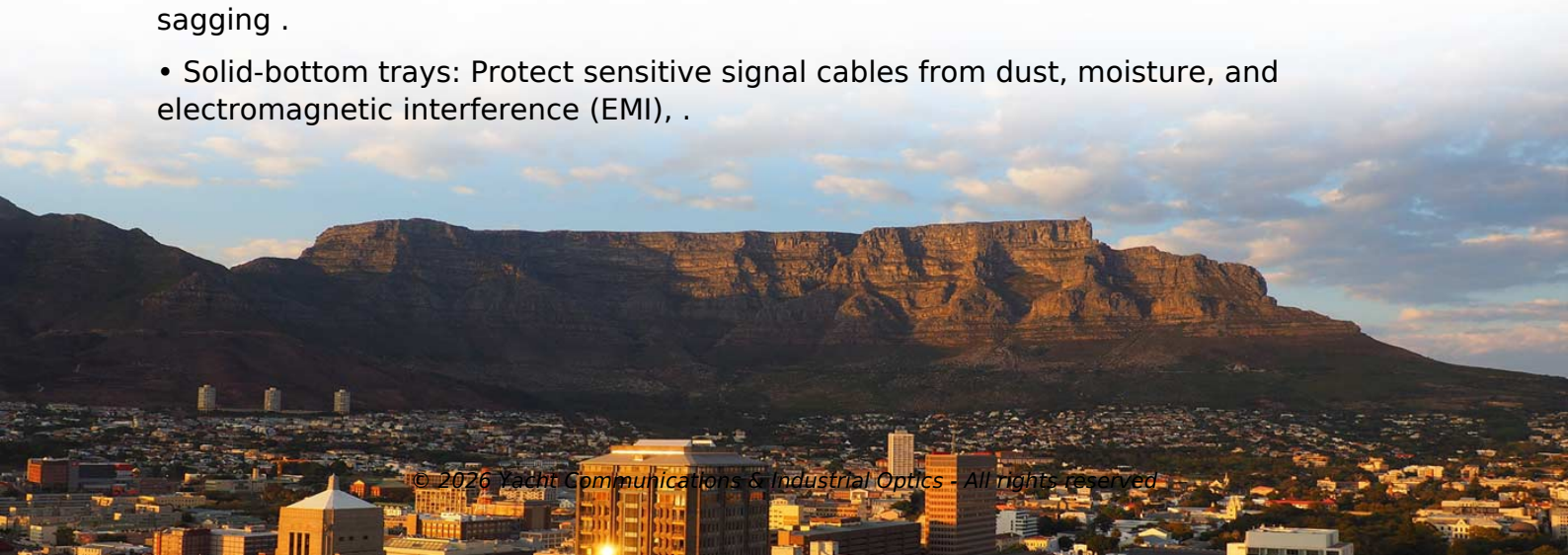
Proper Transition from Trench to Tray

When cables come out of a cable trench and continue along a cable tray, it is essential to maintain a smooth and secure transition. Abrupt bends or unsupported spans can damage cable insulation or conductors. Use gentle bends and ensure the tray is aligned with the trench exit to prevent mechanical stress on the cables .

Cable Tray Selection and Support

Choose the appropriate type of cable tray based on the cable type and environmental conditions:

- Ladder trays: Ideal for large power cables and long runs requiring ventilation .
- Ventilated troughs: Suitable for smaller control or instrumentation cables to prevent sagging .
- Solid-bottom trays: Protect sensitive signal cables from dust, moisture, and electromagnetic interference (EMI), .
