- **Clamp Adjustment:** The splicer's clamps must be configured to hold a single fiber securely. Some ribbon splicers have universal or replaceable clamps that can be set for 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, or 12 fibers .
- **Stripping Length:** Single-core fibers may require a longer stripped section to fit properly in the clamp, which can slightly complicate preparation .
- **Efficiency:** While ribbon splicers can perform single-core splicing, they are optimized for multi-fiber ribbons. Using them for single fibers may be less efficient than using a dedicated single-core splicer, especially for large-scale projects .
