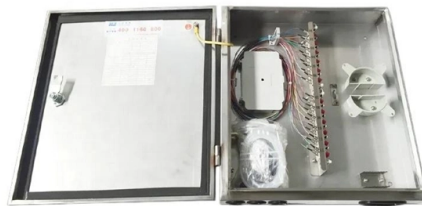


Distribution Box Circuit Diversion Principle



Article Overview

The distribution box diverts electrical current to multiple circuits using parallel paths, with each branch receiving current inversely proportional to its resistance, while protective devices ensure safe operation.

Overview of a Distribution Box

A distribution box (or distribution board) is a centralized unit that receives electrical power from the main supply and distributes it to various subsidiary circuits within a building or facility . It acts as a control hub, ensuring organized and safe flow of electricity to different areas or appliances. Key components include:

- Main switch or MCCB: Controls the incoming power supply and allows isolation of the entire system .
- Busbars: Conductors that carry current from the main supply to individual circuit breakers .
- Circuit breakers (MCBs, RCBOs): Protect each branch circuit from overloads, short circuits, and leakage currents .
- Neutral and Earth busbars: Provide return paths for current and safe dissipation of fault currents .
- DIN rail and enclosure: Secure and protect all components .
