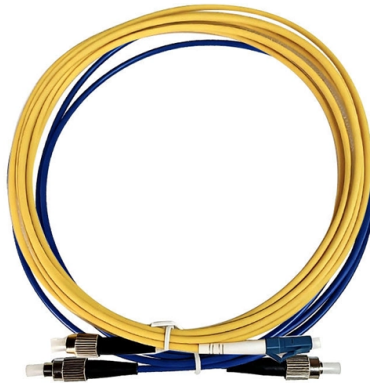


Distribution boxes should not be embedded in external walls
