Why Ground the Distribution Box

Grounding a distribution box is essential for safety. A properly grounded box provides a path for fault currents, preventing the metal enclosure from becoming live and reducing the risk of electric shock. Even if the internal wiring is grounded, the box itself can become a hazard if a wire accidentally contacts the metal body. Grounding also helps dissipate static charges that may accumulate on metal surfaces, especially in high-voltage or industrial environments .

Code Requirements

According to the National Electrical Code (NEC):

- NEC 250.148: Metallic junction boxes and cabinet doors must be bonded to ground using a designated grounding screw or clip .
- NEC 314.28: Metal boxes must be reliably grounded and bonded .
- NEC 110.26: Ensures safe access to equipment doors, which indirectly supports proper grounding practices . These codes make it clear that grounding is not optional for metal distribution boxes.
