

Emergency power distribution box meter markings



Article Overview

Emergency power distribution boxes and meters must be permanently marked to clearly identify them as part of an emergency system, with distinctive markings on boxes, cables, and receptacles.

Identification of Boxes and Enclosures

All boxes, enclosures, transfer switches, generators, and power panels used for emergency circuits must be permanently marked so they are readily identifiable as part of an emergency system. This marking can be done using labels, engraved plates, or color coding on the box or cover to distinguish them from non-emergency equipment (NEC 700.10(A)), .

Marking of Cables and Raceway Systems

When boxes or enclosures are not present, any exposed cables or raceways that are part of the emergency system must be permanently marked at intervals not exceeding 25 feet. This ensures that anyone inspecting or servicing the system can easily identify emergency circuits even in areas without junction boxes .

Emergency Receptacles

Receptacles supplied from the emergency system must have distinctive colors or markings on the cover plates or the receptacles themselves. This allows users to quickly locate outlets that remain powered during a power outage, which is critical for safety and operational continuity .
