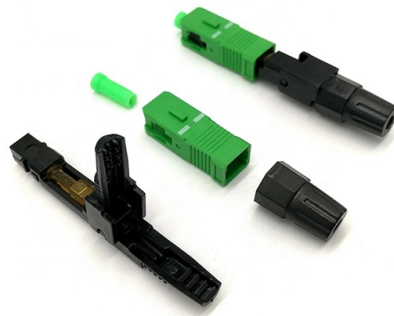


Fiber optic aggregation switch port
