A fiber optic router can be powered using either an AC adapter or a DC power source, following proper wiring and polarity guidelines for safe operation.

Connecting to AC Power

Most fiber optic routers come with an AC power adapter. To connect:

- Locate the AC power input on your router, usually labeled "AC IN."
- Plug the provided AC adapter into the router and then into a wall outlet.
- Ensure the outlet is live and the router powers on, indicated by the status lights.

Connecting to DC Power

Some routers support DC power as a primary or backup source. To connect a DC power source:

- Turn off the DC power source at the circuit to ensure safety.
- Prepare the wires: Strip about 0.25 inches of insulation from both positive and negative wires.
- Insert wires into the DC connector: Match polarity carefully—positive to positive, negative to negative.
- Secure the connection: Tighten the terminal screws on the connector to the recommended torque (e.g., 1.243 N-m or 11 lbf-in) to ensure a stable connection.
