It allows for flexible routing of fibers, leading them from the incoming cable to the distribution pigtails or jumpers, facilitating network scalability and reconfiguration without disrupting service .

Applications: Optical cable continuity boxes are widely used in FTTH (Fiber to the Home) deployments, data centers, and enterprise networks. They can be wall-mounted, pole-mounted, or cabinet-type, depending on the installation environment and fiber count . They also support value-added modules like optical splitters or wavelength division multiplexers when required.
