In most electrical systems, the blue wire typically serves as the neutral conductor, completing the circuit by returning current to the source, though in three-phase systems it may represent a specific phase.

Function of the Blue Wire

In residential wiring, especially in Europe and countries following IEC standards, the blue wire is generally the neutral wire. It connects to the neutral bar in the distribution box and provides a return path for current back to the power source, completing the electrical circuit safely. This is essential for proper operation of devices and for maintaining system safety. In three-phase systems, the blue wire may indicate Line 2 (L2), one of the three phases used to balance loads across the system. Correct identification of phase wires is critical to prevent unbalanced loads, equipment damage, or safety hazards. In low-voltage or control circuits, the blue wire can also serve as a signal or switched wire, such as in lighting control, alarm systems, or home automation setups. Its role depends on the specific design of the circuit.

Connection in the Distribution Box

A distribution box contains components like MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, busbars, neutral bars, and earth bars. The blue wire is typically connected to the neutral bar, which is linked to the main neutral of the incoming supply. From there, it completes circuits for individual outgoing lines. In three-phase setups, it may connect to the corresponding phase busbar if used as a phase conductor.
