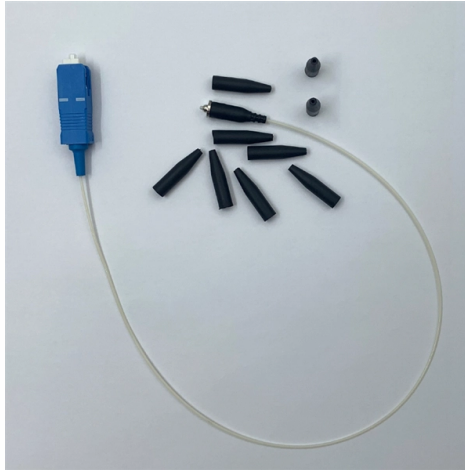


How many wiring groups are there in a residential electrical distribution box
