

# How to route cables in a mesh cable tray

- Avoid overcrowding; do not exceed 40% of tray capacity to prevent overheating and ensure proper ventilation .
- Maintain gentle bends; avoid sharp angles that can damage insulation .

### Secure Cables

- Use cable ties, Velcro straps, or clamps to secure cables at regular intervals, typically every 1-2 meters depending on cable weight and tray load .
- Ensure cables are supported along bends and risers to prevent sagging or stress .

### Labeling and Identification

- Label cables and tray sections clearly for easy identification and future maintenance .
