A core switch serves as the high-capacity backbone of a network, handling large volumes of traffic between network segments, while a normal (or access) switch connects end devices and manages lower traffic loads.

Core Switch

A core switch is positioned at the backbone or core layer of a network and is responsible for routing and switching large amounts of data between distribution and access layers . It is designed for high performance, low latency, and reliability, often featuring advanced protocols, redundancy, and scalability . Core switches aggregate traffic from multiple access or distribution switches, ensuring smooth communication across departments, data centers, or campus networks . They typically have high port density, large cache sizes, and burst traffic handling capabilities, making them suitable for enterprise or data center environments .

Normal (Access) Switch

A normal switch, often called an access switch, operates at the edge of the network to connect end devices such as computers, printers, and IP phones . These switches handle moderate traffic loads and provide basic switching capabilities. They are cost-effective and ideal for small office networks or local area networks (LANs). Access switches focus on device-level connectivity rather than high-speed inter-network routing, and they typically have fewer ports and smaller cache sizes compared to core switches .
