

# Is there only one low-voltage cable inside the cable tray



## Overview

Tray cable (typically VNTC or XHHW construction) carries 208V and 480V power circuits, while separate trays handle low-voltage network and fiber cabling. The TC-ER rating allows direct connection from tray to equipment without conduit transitions. NEC Article 392 governs cable tray installations, covering tray types, fill limits, cable types permitted, and ampacity adjustments. The fill rules differ significantly between single-conductor cables and multiconductor cables, and between ladder tray and solid-bottom tray. Here is the summary of the main points found in NEC Article. The primary rulebook used in the safe use of cable trays is NEC Article 392.
