Unlike access switches, which connect directly to end-user devices, core switches aggregate and route traffic between other switches, ensuring smooth communication and minimizing bottlenecks.

Security Features of Core Switches

A security core switch extends the functionality of a standard core switch by integrating advanced security mechanisms to safeguard the network. Key security features include:

- Access Control Lists (ACLs): Define rules to permit or deny traffic based on IP addresses, protocols, or ports, preventing unauthorized access.
- 802.1X Authentication: Ensures that only authenticated devices can connect to the network, enhancing endpoint security.
- Network Access Control (NAC): Monitors and enforces security policies for devices connecting to the network.
