

Method for hanging fiber optic cables on utility poles



Article Overview

Fiber optic cables can be safely and effectively hung on utility poles using proper planning, hardware, tensioning, and safety procedures.

Planning and Preparation

Before installation, survey the route and obtain all necessary permits from pole owners and local authorities. Determine splice points, slack storage, and pole readiness. Ensure coordination with other utilities if sharing poles, and plan for traffic or pedestrian management near the work area .

Cable Types

- ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting): Non-metallic, carries its own weight, suitable near power lines, requires careful tensioning .
- Figure-8 / Self-supporting: Integrated steel messenger, simple to hang, rated for specific span lengths .
- Lashed cables: Fiber lashed to a pre-installed messenger strand, flexible for adding fibers to existing networks .

Hardware and Attachment

Use eyebolts, insulators, crossarms, and boards as required. For lashed cables, maintain proper spacing for straps and spacers, and form drip loops at handholes and building entries. Ensure messenger wires are neatly terminated and all service loops are secured respecting the cable's minimum bend radius .
