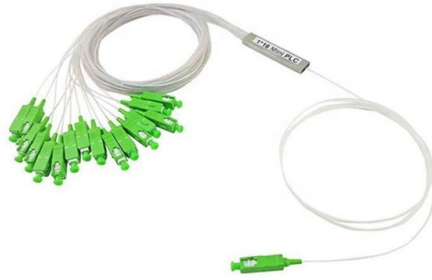


Potential Risks of Single-Path Optical Fiber Cables
