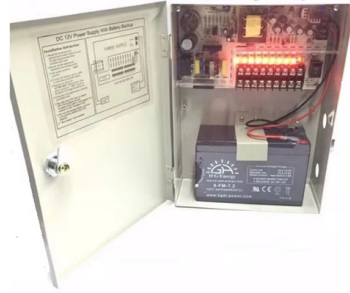


Requirements for Spacing of Fire Cable Tray Supports



Article Overview

Fire-rated cable tray supports should typically be spaced between 1.5 and 3 meters for horizontal runs, with vertical runs supported at intervals not exceeding 1.5 meters, using fire-resistant materials.

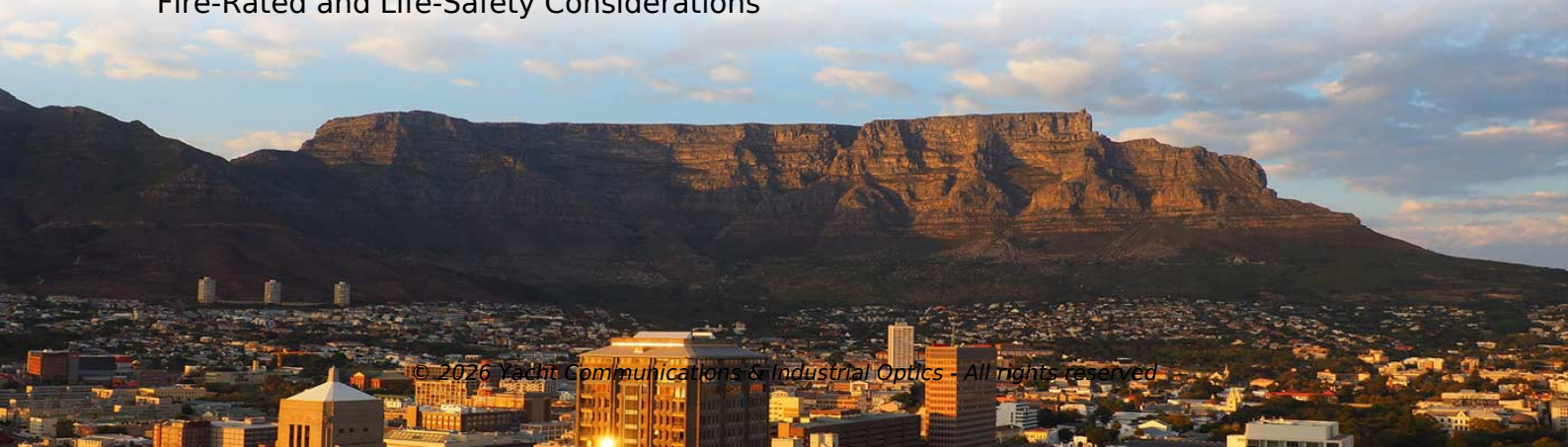
Horizontal Cable Tray Supports

For horizontal runs, supports should be installed at the start, end, and at every turn of the tray. Along straight sections, supports are generally spaced every 1.5 to 3 meters, depending on the tray type, cable load, and manufacturer recommendations. Additional supports are required near concentrated loads, such as cable entry or exit points, to prevent sagging and mechanical strain. All supports must be fire-resistant, ensuring the cable system remains intact during a fire.

Vertical Cable Tray Supports

For vertical runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure at intervals not exceeding 1.5 meters. Cables within vertical trays should be secured at the top and at every 1.5 meters to maintain stability and prevent undue mechanical stress. Hanging rod supports for vertical trays should be at least 8 mm in diameter to ensure structural integrity.
