

Safety Precautions for Fiber Optic Cable Splicing

Proper safety measures for fiber optic splicing include eye protection, careful handling of glass fibers, chemical safety, electrical precautions, and maintaining a clean, controlled work environment.

Eye and Laser Safety

Never look directly into a fiber optic cable, as the light transmitted is often invisible and can cause eye damage. Use a fiber optic power meter or visual fault detector to confirm the fiber is inactive before inspection. When using microscopes or fusion splicers, ensure infrared filters are in place to protect against invisible infrared light, particularly in the 1300–1550 nm range, which can harm the cornea or lens if focused improperly. Always wear safety glasses with side shields in designated fiber optic work areas .

Handling Fiber Scraps

Broken fiber ends and scraps are extremely sharp and can penetrate skin. Use tweezers to pick up cleaved pieces and place them in a dedicated, sealed container. Avoid dropping fibers on the floor or leaving them on work surfaces, and never allow them to contact clothing or food. Maintain good housekeeping to prevent accidental injury .
