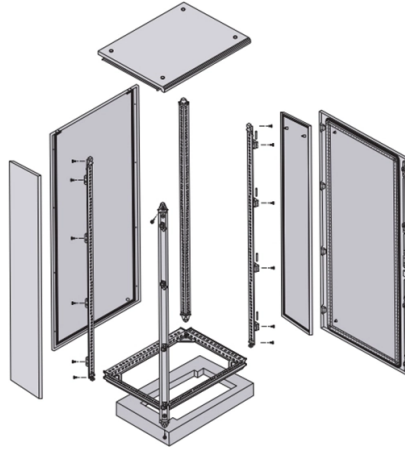


Single-mode single-fiber and single-mode dual-fiber optical modules



Article Overview

Single-mode dual-fiber modules use two fibers for separate transmit and receive channels, while single-mode single-fiber (BiDi) modules achieve bidirectional communication over a single fiber using different wavelengths.

Core Differences

1. Fiber Usage

- **Single-Fiber (BiDi) Modules:** Use one fiber for both transmitting and receiving data by employing Wavelength Division Multiplexing (WDM). One wavelength handles transmission, and another handles reception, requiring matched BiDi modules at each end ().

- **Dual-Fiber Modules:** Use two separate fibers—one for transmitting (TX) and one for receiving (RX). This is the standard duplex configuration ().

2. Installation and Compatibility

- **BiDi Modules:** Require paired modules with complementary wavelengths (e.g., TX1310/RX1550 at one end and TX1550/RX1310 at the other). They simplify cabling and reduce fiber count but need careful wavelength matching ().

- **Dual-Fiber Modules:** Can connect any two standard duplex modules without wavelength pairing. Installation is straightforward and compatible with most existing network designs ().
