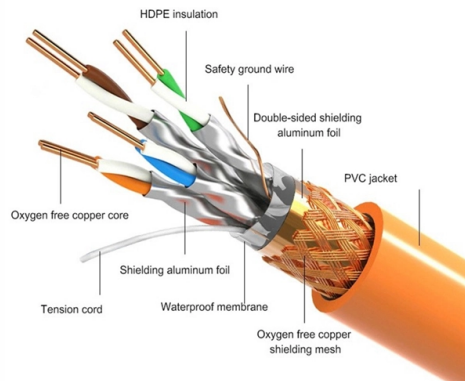


Spacing of fixed cable trays

Proper fixed spacing of cable trays ensures safety, accessibility, heat dissipation, and structural integrity in electrical installations.

Horizontal and Vertical Spacing

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the minimum distance between them should be 0.6 meters. This spacing allows for maintenance access, inspection, proper airflow for heat dissipation, and reduces the risk of cables touching, which could lead to short circuits or interference. Adequate horizontal spacing is also critical to maintain a safe working environment and prevent obstruction. Vertical spacing between trays depends on the cable type, tray material, and environment. Proper vertical separation ensures ventilation, cooling, and reduced electromagnetic interference (EMI), while also allowing for future expansion or rearrangement of cables.

Support Intervals

Cable trays must be supported at regular intervals to prevent sagging and mechanical strain. Hanging rod supports should be at least 8 mm in diameter for vertical runs, ensuring stability and preventing stress on cables at bends or turns. Support distances vary depending on tray type and load, but all cables should be supported to avoid undue mechanical strain and ensure compliance with fire safety regulations.
