Cable tray supports and hangers must comply with IEC 61537 and BS 6946 standards, ensuring proper load capacity, spacing, material selection, and fire resistance for safe cable management.

Key Standards and Guidelines

Cable tray systems and their supports are primarily governed by IEC 61537, which specifies construction, testing, and performance requirements for metallic cable trays, and BS 6946, which addresses safe working loads and installation practices in the UK . These standards ensure that trays can safely support the weight of cables, environmental loads, and any imposed mechanical stresses.

Material and Corrosion Protection

Supports and hangers are typically made from steel, stainless steel, or aluminum, with galvanization or other coatings applied to resist corrosion, especially in industrial or outdoor environments . Non-metallic banding is recommended for packaging to prevent rust stains and contamination of stainless steel products .

Load and Mechanical Requirements

Cable tray supports must withstand:

- The weight of the cables and tray itself
- Environmental loads such as wind, ice, or snow
