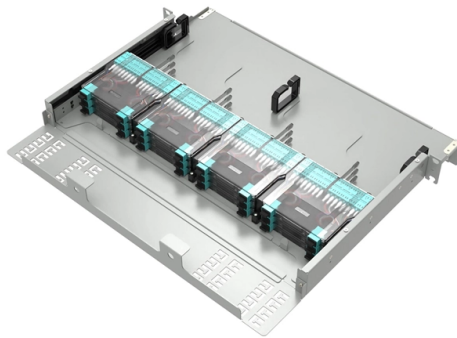


The role of the resistor in a fiber optic sensor

The optical fiber offers dual functionality: measurement of several parameters through changes in the properties of light propagating. Resistors play a crucial role in sensor design, including signal conditioning, voltage control, temperature compensation, impedance matching, and protection.
