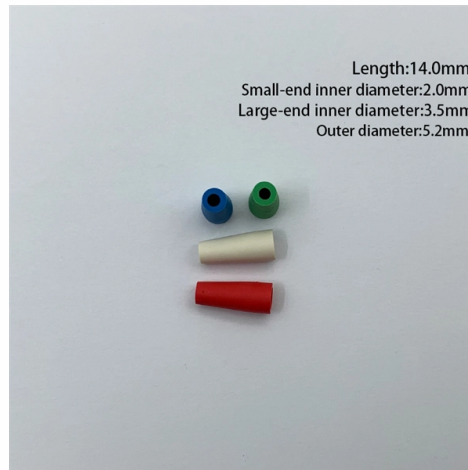

It serves the safe accommodation, routing, distribution, and maintenance of power and data lines in cities, industrial plants, transportation structures, and tunnels.
