Key Differences

Distribution Box: A distribution box, also called a distribution board or panel, is the central hub that receives the main electrical supply and distributes it to multiple circuits. It contains protective devices such as circuit breakers, fuses, and residual current devices (RCDs) to prevent overloads, short circuits, and earth faults. It manages higher voltages (typically 220V–690V) and currents, allowing safe isolation and maintenance of individual circuits without disrupting the entire system .

Junction Box: A junction box is primarily an enclosure for connecting, branching, or terminating wires. It does not distribute power or include protective devices like circuit breakers. Its main purpose is to provide a safe, organized space for wire splices, ensuring proper insulation and preventing loose connections that could cause fires. Junction boxes are generally used for lower-voltage applications (12V–240V) and are smaller and simpler than distribution boxes .

Functional Roles

- **Distribution Box:** Centralized power distribution, circuit protection, and sometimes monitoring. Found in electrical rooms, basements, or service areas where main circuits converge. Handles multiple circuits and higher power loads .
- **Junction Box:** Local wire connections, branching, or rerouting. Ensures safe and accessible wiring architecture, often used in ceilings, walls, or along conduits. Focuses on protecting connections rather than controlling or distributing power .
