All-optical Ethernet switches and hybrid switches with fiber modules use optical ports to transmit data via fiber optic cables.

Types of Switches with Optical Ports

All-optical Ethernet switches are designed with service ports that are entirely optical, meaning every interface connects via fiber rather than copper. These switches are ideal for high-performance environments such as data center cores, aggregation layers, and high-speed campus networks, supporting speeds from 10G up to 160G . They eliminate the need for electro-optical conversion, reducing latency and signal degradation . Hybrid switches combine both optical and Ethernet (copper) ports. They allow flexible deployment where some connections use fiber for long-distance or high-speed links, while others use traditional RJ45 Ethernet for shorter distances . Optical ports on these switches typically accommodate SFP, SFP+, QSFP, or QSFP28 modules, supporting speeds from 1G to 100G or higher .

Characteristics of Optical Ports

- Transmission medium: Fiber optic cables, unlike copper Ethernet cables .
- Speeds: Commonly 1.25G, 10G, 25G, 40G, 100G, and higher .
- Distance: Can transmit data over tens of kilometers, far exceeding the ~100 meters limit of copper Ethernet .
- Interface types: LC, SC, MPO, or RJ45 modules for hybrid compatibility .
